WEXFORD COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

Regular Meeting * Wednesday, December 02, 2015

Meeting called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Chairman Leslie Housler.

Roll call: Present – Commissioners Michael MacCready, Leslie Housler, Robert Hilty, Mar Howie, Gideon Mitchell, Julie Theobald, Gary Taylor, John Fuscone and Bill Goodwill.

Roll call: Motion to delete J.2 Revised Ordinance #5 passed 7 to 2 with Comm Howie and Comm Mitchell voting against the motion.

Public Comments

Dick LaBar, 6416 N. 33 Road, Greenwood Township, appeared before the Board to speak to them on the Zoning Ordinance. He touched on the impact the County may see if Zoning was eliminated. Cost sharing with the County may be an option that townships would be interested in.

Ron Vaughan, Cherry Grove Township Supervisor, believes the County needs Zoning. There are 13 townships that want County Zoning and may be willing to help support it. Wexford County Board of Commissioners Regular Meeting * Wednesday, December 2, 2016 Page two (2)

The County needs to budget more than \$20,000 for this department. If there is some buy in from the Townships the revenue may increase between \$15,000 - \$20,000. The additional revenue would allow the County to have real zoning.

Mike Nix, Manton, requested that the Board pick the lowest bidder for operation of the Cedar Creek Water System.

Tony Rubio, 1081 Chestnut, Cadillac, would like to see a County Veterans Service. He feels it will bring many benefits for veterans and added revenue to the County. He offered to help in anyway.

- 3. Infrastructure Alternative Inc. Agreement

MOTION by Comm Fuscone, seconded by Comm Howie to approve the Infrastructure Alternative Inc. Agreement for the operation and maintenance of the Cedar Creek Water System, and authorize the chairman to sign on behalf of the County, as presented.

The annual cost for the contract with Infrastructure Alternative Inc. agreement would be \$49,910, which was the second highest bid. Wade Trim bid amount was \$70,000. It was pointed out that the BPW did not approve Wade Trim to be the operator due to the much higher bid amount. Board members then discussed the additional information requested from the bidders and if that impacted the bid amount. One Board member felt Instructure provided additional services above the other bidders. Others felt Wade Trim would be a better fit because they designed the water system.

The question was called for.

<u>MOTION</u> by Comm Fuscone, seconded by Comm Mitchell to call the question.

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Roll call: Motion failed four to five with Comm Housler, Hilty, Taylor, Goodwill and MacCready voting against the motion.

The discussion continued.

Some Board members explained their support for Infrastructure was partially based on the great job they are doing for Haring Township, currently. Other Commissioners felt that Infrastructure will be maintaining the intangibles, which is essential. It was also pointed out that the BPW supported Infrastructure after two separate votes (5/2 and 4/3).

Roll call: Motion passed five to four with Commissioners MacCready, Housler, Hilty and Goodwill voting against the motion.

4. Asset Recovery & Mgt. Services Agreement

MOTION by Comm Howie, seconded by Comm Theobald to approve the agreement between Concierge Corrections and Wexford County for a period of 24 months beginning December 2, 2015 and ending December 1, 2017, and authorize the chairman to sign on behalf of the County, as presented.

Roll call: Motion approved unanimously.

5. Proposed 2016 Budget

<u>MOTION</u> by Comm Taylor, seconded by Comm Fuscone to approve the 2016 Wexford County Budget, and hold a public hearing on Thursday December 17, 2015, as presented.

The Finance Committee has been working on this long process for a number of months. Next year Adm. Jordan will be a great asset in budget preparation. For the 2016 Budget, \$406,000 was taken from the County's reserve. Also, at the last budget meeting both Judge Fagerman and Sheriff Finstrom agreed they will do their best to curb spending through the year. It was pointed out that the fund balance held by the County is used for paying County bills until June. It is used for cash flow for the County.

Roll call: Motion passed eight to one with Comm MacCready voting against the motion.

6. BOC Proposed Meeting Date Change

MOTION by Comm Fuscone, seconded by Comm Theobald to approve the date change for the upcoming BOC meeting to Thursday December 17, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. for the purpose of a public hearing on the 2016 budget, as presented.

MOTION by Comm Fuscone, seconded by Comm Taylor to approve Resolution 15-29, County of Wexford, State of Michigan Resolution to Approve Conveyance of Additional Real and Personal Property Related to the Lake Mitchell Sewer System and Matters Related Thereto, as presented.

With the approval of this resolution, the DPW property will be transferred over to the townships using the sewer system. Adm. Jordan provided Board members with a packet of minutes and payables for the sewer project dating back to 1976 and 1977. It was pointed out that the property where the DPW building sits was purchased for \$8000 with sewer fees. They then discussed the assets that are now in the building. If Mesick and Haring make any claim to the assets at the DPW, that would be the problem of townships taking over the sewer system.

Motion withdrawn by Comm Fuscone and the support was withdrawn by Comm Taylor.

He, counsel and a couple of Commissioners have a possible tentative agreement with the TPOAM General and Courts units on soon to be expiring union contracts.
